
A Program of Strategic Importance

The Gulf has emerged as the world's key strategic political and economic region and as the bridge between East and West.

- The Gulf contains two-thirds of the world's proven reserves of oil and currently supplies 30% of world total demand. Dependency on the Gulf will likely increase in the near future.
- The Gulf States boast among the highest GDPs per capita in the world with strong business relations throughout the world. The GDP of the GCC countries has doubled by over 75% from 2003 to 2007. The cumulative current surplus in 2007 reached 700 billion US dollars.
- The geographic location of the Gulf at the junction of Europe, Asia and Africa means developing partnerships with these regions and new opportunities.
- The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is home to Islam and the center of the Islamic world.
- The Gulf region has witnessed three major conflicts in the past 25 years. These conflicts have had a world wide impact. Current events in Iraq and Japan have consequences on regional stability.
- The Gulf region is in the midst of accelerating and transformational political and economic change.

Understanding of the Gulf region today is absolutely essential.





What Is "The Gulf In-Depth" Program?

- An innovative and in-depth executive learning program focusing on the key strategic aspects of the Arab Gulf Region and its linkages to the international community.

Providing Unparalell Experience and Expertise

The Program is being coordinated by the Gulf Research Center, the only independent think tank in the region and a pioneer of a number of academic research programs and political, social, economic and strategic initiatives. The GRC combines the qualities of research expertise, a broad network of researchers and partners from which to draw on with its indepth knowledge about the current status of public policy research in the Arab world and the Gulf region.

Methodology

Oman. The program is developed around three layers:

- CLASSROOM TEACHING structured around individual presentations focusing on a specific aspect of the overall topic.
- OPEN DISCUSSION PERIODS to strengthen analytical skills and to provide a forum for better communication and interaction among the participants.
- INTERACTION WITH GCC PERSONALITIES to build a strong network of contacts on which they can build for future relationships.





Who Should Attend?

- Government officials whose work relates to the Gulf and who wish to gain a deep understanding of the political, social and economic intricacies of the region in order to be able to see developments within a larger context.
- Corporate officials who wish to take advantage of the growing commercial opportunities in the region. By having a more comprehensive understanding of the opportunities and obstacles present, chances for successful business endeavours are far greater.
- Mid- to high-level professionals who seek a qualitative edge to the information they receive and to the relationships they want to build.

The Gulf In-Depth Program reflects the complexities of today's global environment and the overlapping and intersecting interests of various sectors of society. As such, the composition of the participants is a reflection of the multitude of institutions concerned with the current status and future development of the Gulf region.







Eligibility

The conference language will be English thus applicants must have a thorough working knowledge of the English language to be able to follow the presentations and engage in detailed discussion and exchange of opinion.

Successful candidates are expected to attend all sessions of the program meaning they have to be able to confirm their availability for the entire period of the workshop. Participants are given one day each for arrival and departure.

Once candidates have been accepted, they will be provided with a username and password enabling them access to the dedicated program website which includes the program's reading materials and their personal information. Participants will be able to use their access to receive any updates to the program, edit their own profiles or convey any questions and concerns to the relevant GRC personnel. As material will be constantly added right up the beginning of the program, individuals will be encouraged and expected to check in regularly to the web portal.
