GCC-EU Relations: Toward the Strategic Partnership Webinar Series



The eighth session of the GCC-EU webinar series entitled “Health Resilience” was held by the Gulf Research Center (GRC) on April 11, 2023. The event focused on the status of relations and the priorities in the health field as they relate to the EU’s Joint Communication on a “Strategic Partnership with the Gulf.” The speakers of the session were Dr. Sami Almudarra, Director of Health Information at the Gulf Center for Disease Prevention and Control; Dr. Yahya Alfarsi, Consultant in Public Health at the Gulf Health Council; Tobias Mac-Lean, Policy Officer at DG HERA at the European Commission; Sina Winkel, Project Manager at CARPO; and Dr. Reem AlSukait, Assistant Professor at King Saud University. Dr. Christian Koch, the Director of Research at the Gulf

Research Center, moderated the session.

The webinar centered around different themes. The first theme was the key lessons from the COVID-19 pandemic; learning from the COVID-19 experience is critical in preparing for future pandemics in both regions. For example, there is a continued need to improve pandemic preparedness and responses, public health delivery, and response capacity. A second theme was the collective effort that can be put forth to support better coordination and cooperation. Here, trust plays a primary role in health resilience. The speakers of the webinar elaborated on intergovernmental trust, trust between disciplines, and trust between the government and the

public playing significant roles in health resilience. A third theme centered on digital health. The session stressed the importance of virtual healthcare services (especially during lockdowns) and the importance of digital passports in preventing the spread of pandemics and managing the public health record. The importance of sharing resources and data was also emphasized, as open science enabled global solutions, models, and policies. Finally, there was

a focus on the broader picture of medium- to long-term recovery instruments including the promotion of healthier lifestyles in both regions. As the population is changing, it is thus essential to look at non-communicable diseases, such as obesity, to lower the risks of hospitalizations during pandemics. Here, improving communication in different disciplines, increasing public engagement in science and data, and promoting science literacy is crucial in planning for a better future.

Global Leadership Program

- Broaden professional networks across cultures and professional domains, through interaction with peers and experts within the program environment.

GLMMs public databases

The GLMM gathers, analyses, and republishes national official statistical data concerning population, labor markets, and migration from dozens of websites across the GCC countries. All these data can be viewed, printed, and downloaded in MS Excel. Having done this for more than a decade, GLMM’s database contains data that is no longer publicly available, except via the GLMM website, which can be accessed [here](#).

Webinar

GLMM announced its first webinar “GCC Data for Evidence-based Policymaking” for 14 June 2023.

Abstract: To what extent do available data and statistics on labour and labour migration in GCC states allow policymakers, as well as the general public, to monitor and understand the rapid changes affecting GCC states’ labour markets since 2010? The webinar will review recent innovations and improvements in the collection, processing, and dissemination of statistical data on labour, migration, and labour migration in the six GCC states. It will assess progress made in the use of statistical data for socio-economic and demographic policy making in the region. It will highlight challenges met by GCC National Statistical Organisations and other statistics producers in the region and reflect on possible ways to overcome these challenges.


