GCC-EU Relations: Toward the Strategic Partnership Webinar Series

Panel Session 11: Humanitarian and Development Cooperation



The eleventh session of the GCC-EU webinar series entitled "Humanitarian and Development Cooperation" was held by the Gulf Research Center (GRC) on June 12, 2023. The event focused on the status of relations and the priorities in the field of humanitarian and development cooperation as they relate to the EU's Joint Communication on a "Strategic Partnership with the Gulf." The speakers of the session were Dr. Aqeel Al Ghamdi, the Assistant Supervisor General for Development and Planning at the King Salman Humanitarian Aid and Relief Centre (KSRelief); Prof. Dr. Michael Koehler, the Deputy Director-General of the Directorate-General for European Civil Protection and Humanitarian Aid Operations (ECHO) at the European Commission; Mr.

Alessandro Villa, the Deputy Head of Unit of the Directorate-General for International Partnerships, Middle East Division (INTPA.C.1) at the European Commission; Dr. Yannick du Pont, the CEO of SPARK; and Mr. Amer Bukvić, the Acting Director General of Global Practice & Partnerships (DG-GPP) at the Islamic Development Bank. Dr. Christian Koch, the Director of Research at the Gulf Research Center, moderated the session.

The webinar highlighted that cooperation on humanitarian and development aid is already strong between the EU and the GCC on a bilateral level between European institutions (such as European Commission) and major Gulf donors

(such as the Islamic Development Bank). With the increasing global humanitarian crisis, however, there is an urgency to push for stronger

global partnerships and more strategic cooperation between the GCC and EU.

Panel Session 10: Promoting Transport



The tenth session of the GCC-EU webinar series entitled "Promoting Transport" was held by the Gulf Research Center (GRC) on June 6, 2023. The event focused on the status of relations and the priorities in the field of transport as they relate to the EU's Joint Communication on a "Strategic Partnership with the Gulf." The speakers of the session were Mr. Carlos Bermejo Acosta, Head of the Aviation Agreements Unit of the Directorate General for Mobility and Transport (DG MOVE) at the European Commission; Mr. Ralf Zinelabedin, Consultant to the Director of Europe & Middle East at DB Engineering & Consulting; and Dr. Dua Rubal, Fellow at King Abdullah Petroleum Studies and Research Center (KAPSARC). Dr. Christian Koch, the Director of Research at the Gulf Research Center, moderated the session.

The webinar reiterated the importance of the Gulf region to the EU, given its strategic location between Europe, Asia, and Africa. Overall, the speakers recognized the importance of continuing and deepening cooperation in the transport sector, particularly in railway and aviation, through exchanging expertise to further a mutually beneficial dialogue. The speakers discussed key railway and aviation issues, including the EU aviation strategy, critical recent developments of the GCC railway project and EU railway policy, management of shared railway systems, with a focus on the EU framework for interoperability and safety, and technical, institutional, and regulatory requirements in both the aviation and the railway sectors.

Global Economics Module: 4 – 8 March 2024


The program offers participants the opportunity to:

The Gulf Labour Markets, Migration, and Population (GLMM) programme is an international independent, non-partisan, non-profit programme promoted and hosted by the GRC. You can access the GLMM website <u>here</u>.

Data

GLMM gathers, analyses, and republishes weekly national official statistical data concerning population, labour markets, and migration from dozens of websites of the GCC countries. All these data can be viewed, printed, and downloaded in MS Excel. Having done this for more than a decade, the GLMM's database contains data that are no longer publicly available online except through the GLMM <u>website</u>.

Recently, notable data for Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, and Oman were added to the database.

Saudi Arabia

- Saudi Arabia: Population by nationality (Saudi/non-Saudi) and administrative region (governorate) of residence (2022)
- Saudi Arabia: Population by nationality (Saudi/non-Saudi) and sex (2010-2022)
- Saudi Arabia: Workers employed in the government sector by country of citizenship and education level (2022)
- Saudi Arabia: Workers employed in the government sector by country of citizenship, sex and education level (2022)

This is the full list of data on Saudi Arabia.

All GLMM data is gathered from published official national sources. For Saudi Arabia mainly: General Authority for Statistics (GAStat); Ministry of Human Resources and Social development (MHRSD); and General Organization for Social Insurance (GOSI).

Kuwait

- Kuwait: Residency permits issued for the first time, by type/ purpose of permit (2011-2022)
- Kuwait: Residency permits issued for the first time, by nationality group (region) of holders 2011-2022
- Kuwait: Foreign residents who became contraveners to the law on residency, by nationality group (region) 2015-2022
- Kuwait: Cumulated numbers of contravenors to the law on residency, by nationality group (2015-2022)

This is the full list of data on Kuwait.

Oman

- Oman: Employed population by nationality (Omani/ non-Omani), sex and sector of economic activity (private and domestic sectors) (2021)
- Oman: Employed foreign workers by country of citizenship (all sectors, selected nationalities) (2013-2022)
- Oman: Population by nationality (Omani/non-Omani), sex, and age group (2021)
- Oman: Population by nationality (Omani/non-Omani), sex, and age group (2020)

This is the **<u>full list</u>** of data on Oman.

 Based on these data, GLMM produces unique <u>GCC regional</u> tables.

GLMM also gathers, analyses, and republishes weekly national official legal <u>documents</u> concerning population, labour markets, and migration.

Webinar

GLMM held its first webinar "GCC Data for Evidence-Based Policymaking" on 14 June 2023



The webinar focused on the question: "to what extent do available data and statistics on labour and labour migration in GCC states allow policymakers, as well as the general public, to monitor and understand the rapid changes affecting GCC states' labour markets since 2010?" The webinar also reviewed recent innovations and improvements in the collection, processing, and dissemination of statistical data on labour, migration, and labour migration in the six GCC states. The webinar furthermore assessed progress made in the use of statistical data for socio-economic and demographic policy making in the region. The webinar finally highlighted challenges met by GCC National Statistical Organisations and other statistics producers in the region and reflected on possible ways to overcome these challenges.

June 2023

In June 2023, the GRC participated in numerous international events—both online and in-person — tackling issues pertaining to developments in the Gulf region and its broader neighborhood. The GRC emphasizes participating in such events, as it allows for the inclusion of a regional perspective in the debate. The following is an overview of the critical events in which the GRC participated this month.

June 26, 2023

Dr. Mohamed Abdelraouf, Environment and Sustainability Research Program Director spoke in the online session of the SRI congress session Citizen Science and Data for Decision Making.

June 19-20, 2023

Dr. Christian Koch participated in the 5th German-Arab Dialogue on Security and Cooperation held in Berlin, Germany organized by the German-Arab Friendship Group (DAFG), the German Academy for Security Policy (BAKS) and the Konrad-Adenauer Foundation. The conference brought together officials and specialists from the GCC countries and Germany to discuss closer cooperation in the fields of security, political ties, economics and energy.



June 15, 2023

Dr. Christian Koch held a virtual discussion with Dr. Alyare Elmi, Executive Director of the Heritage Institute based in Mogadishu, Somalia. They discussed the work of the GRC on the Horn of Africa and future collaboration.

June 22, 2023

Dr. Christian Koch met with H.E. Haifa Al-Jedea, Ambassador of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to the European Union in Brussels. They discussed the current status of Saudi Arabia-EU ties and how the GRC and the embassy can cooperate closer together.

June 18, 2023

Dr. Abdulaziz Sager and Dr. Christian Koch held a meeting with Darko Mocibob, Director of the Middle East Division in the Department of Political and Peacebuilding Affairs and Peace Operations of the United Nations in Geneva, Switzerland. The meeting was also attended by Amb. Wolfgang Amadeus Bruelhart, the Special Envoy for the Middle East of the Swiss Ministry of Foreign Affairs. They discussed in more detail the next steps in the Tafahum wa Tabadul project of the GRC and CARPO.

June 18, 2023

The Vice President of the Gulf Research Center (GRC), Dr. Ahmed Sager and GRC's Senior Advisor Prof. Saleh Al-Khathlan received at the GRC's office in Riyadh, His Excellency Mr. Jaan Reinhold, Ambassador of the Republic of Estonia (non-resident). During the meeting, issues of common interest between the two sides were discussed.



June 13, 2023

Dr. Christian Koch was interviewed for a Geneva Graduate Institute Applied Research Project on the use of mega-events in the Gulf as part of national branding and communications strategies. Specifically, the students were interested in the experience of the FIFA-Qatar 2022 World Cup and Expo 2020 Dubai.

June 8, 2023

Dr. Christian Koch attended the event on "Rethinking EU-MENA Engagement" held at Carnegie Europe in Brussels. The public discussion focused on how the EU can establish sustainable partnerships and build trust with the wider Middle East and how the EU needs to consider regional and local perspectives in its decisionmaking and meet its partners on equal footing.

June 7, 2023

Dr. Abdulaziz Sager, Chairman of the Gulf Research Center (GRC), received at the GRC's office in Riyadh on June 7, 2023, the Italian Special Envoy to Syria, Ambassador Stefano Ravagnan. Both sides discussed the current developments in Syria, after joining the Arab League Summit.



June 4, 2023

June 8, 2023

June 7, 2023

Dr. Christian Koch held a meeting with officials from the Civil Military Engagement Coordination Section of NATO Strategic Direction South - HUB (the Southern Hub). The Hub, located in Naples, Italy, contributes to NATO's understanding of the South by cooperating with organizations located in Africa and the Middle East and analyzing security efforts and dynamics in the region. The GRC and NATO Strategic Direction South discussed their future engagement and future project work related to the region.

June 6, 2023

Dr. Abdulaziz Sager, Chairman of the Gulf Research Center (GRC), met with the Ambassador of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Mr. Dang Xuan Dzung, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, the Sultanate of Oman, the Kingdom of Bahrain, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan and the Republic of Yemen. Both sides discussed Saudi-Vietnamese relations and ways to develop them in light of the Kingdom's Vision 2030.
